AYHAN KÖSE

Ayhan Köse is Assistant to the Director in the IMF Research Department. He previously worked for the United States and Canada desks of the IMF Western Hemisphere Department. Ayhan Köse received his BA in Industrial Engineering from Bilkent University in 1992 and his PhD in Economics from the University of Iowa in 1997. Before joining the IMF, he was Assistant Professor at Brandeis International Business School. His research focuses on financial globalization, macro-financial linkages, emerging markets and business cycles.

He has authored a number of policy-oriented papers on these topics. Technical versions of many of these papers have been published in leading academic journals, such as the *American Economic Review*, *Journal of International Economics* and *Journal of Development Economics*. His research has been featured in various media outlets, including *the Economist*, *Financial Times* and *Wall Street Journal*. He is the Co-Editor of the *IMF Economic Review* and the Editor of the *IMF Research Bulletin*.

ŞEBNEM KALEMLİ-ÖZCAN

Şebnem Kalemlı-Özcan works in the area of international finance, financial integration and empirical growth theory. She has published papers in such journals as the *American Economic Review*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Review of Economics and Statistics*, *Journal of Economic Growth* and *Journal of Development Economics*. She was the Duisenberg Fellow at the European Central Bank in Spring 2008 and has been a Research Associate at the National Bureau of Economic Research (NBER) since 2000. She currently holds a position as lead economist/advisor, Middle East and North Africa Region at the World Bank and contributes to policy-oriented forums such as *VoxEU.org* and *Global Macro Economist*.

Şebnem Kalemlı-Özcan received her BS in Economics from Middle East Technical University in 1995 and her PhD in Economics from Brown University in 2000. She has been employed as an Assistant Professor of Economics at the University of Houston between 2000 and 2004 and as an Associate Professor between 2004 and 2010. She will hold a position of Professor at the University of Houston as of September 2010.

FABIO CANOVA

Fabio Canova has made outstanding contributions in the area of quantitative macroeconomics during his research career beginning in 1988. He has close to 40 publications in journals such as the *International Economic Review*, *Economic Journal*, *Journal of the European Economic Association*, *Journal of International Economics*, *Journal of Applied Econometrics*, *Journal of Monetary Economics* and *Journal of Money, Credit and Banking*, to name a few. He is the author of the book *Methods for Applied Macroeconomic Research*, published by Princeton University Press in 2007. He has ranked among the top 100 economists in the *Journal of the European*

Economic Association 2003 study and been included in the Applied Econometrics and Econometric Theory Halls of Fame in 1999 and 1998, respectively.

Fabio Canova received his BA in Economics from the University of Modena in 1980, his MA in Economics from the University of Southern California in 1982, and his PhD from the University of Minnesota in 1988. He has been ICREA Research Professor at the Universitat Pompeu Fabra since 2005. He has held numerous positions at Brown University, European University Institute, University of Bern, and Southampton University, to name a few. Fabio Canova is currently an editor at the *Journal of the European Economic Association* and holds various consulting positions.

SUMRU ALTUĞ

Sumru Altuğ is a professor of economics at Koç University, Istanbul, Turkey. She received her B.A. and M.A. degrees in Economics from the University of Pittsburgh (1978, 1980) and a PhD degree in Economics from Carnegie-Mellon University (1985). Her research interests are in the areas of dynamic macroeconomic modeling, business cycles and growth. Sumru Altuğ was on the faculty in the Department of Economics at the University of Minnesota between 1984 and 1994 and held visiting positions at the University of Wisconsin, Duke University and Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University. She was a Visiting Fellow at the National Bureau of Economic Research in 1986 and has been a Research Fellow at the Centre for Economic Policy Research, London, U.K. since 1997. She also held chaired professor positions at the University of Durham and the University of York in the UK during 1999–2002. She has served as an Associate Editor for the *Economic Journal* (2000–2003) and as a member of the Economic and Social Research Council Politics, Economics, and Geography (PEG) Research College, UK (2001–2003).

She is the author or co-editor of several well known texts in macroeconomics from Cambridge University Press issued in 2003 and 2008. Her most recent work is a monograph entitled *Business Cycles: Fact, Fantasy, and Fallacy*, published by World Scientific (2010).

ADRIAN PAGAN

Adrian Pagan is Professor of Economics in the School of Economics and Finance, Queensland University of Technology and University of Technology, Sydney. He is also a Senior Research Fellow at Nuffield College, Oxford University. He has published over 120 papers and three books in the area of theoretical and applied econometrics. He is a Fellow of the Academy of Social Sciences, the Econometric Society and the Journal of Econometrics; a Medallist Fellow of the Modelling and Simulation Society of Australia and New Zealand; a Distinguished Author of the Journal of Applied Econometrics and has been awarded the Distinguished Fellow Medal of the Economic Society of Australia and the Centenary Medal.

He has held visiting and permanent appointments at a number of universities around the world including the University of Oxford, the University of Rochester, Princeton University, Yale University, Johns Hopkins University, the University of California at Los Angeles and the University of New South Wales. During 1995-2000 he was a member of the Board of Directors of the Reserve Bank of Australia. He has consulted with a number of central banks about the

design of macro-econometric models for monetary policy, including the Bank of England, the European Central Bank and the Norges Bank.

MELİKE BİLDİRİCİ

Melike Bildirici is a professor at Yıldız Technical University (YTU). She works in the areas of macroeconomics and non-linear econometrics. Her articles on the global economy and economic crises have been published in journals such as *The Journal of Energy and Development*, *Expert Systems with Applications*, *Applied Econometrics and International Development*, *International Journal of Applied Econometrics and Quantitative Studies*, *Journal of Economic and Social Research* and *METU Studies in Development*.

Bidirici has received science incentive awards from TÜBİTAK in 2009 and 2010 as well as academic awards from YTU between 1998 and 2001 and in 2010.
